Summary:

Fuller Seminary, Graduate School of Psychology invites applications for a postdoctoral research position in the Thrive Center for Human Development. The post-holder will take a leadership position in research and administration of a major research initiative on “The Science of Intellectual Humility,” funded by the John Templeton Foundation. The three-year post begins May 1, 2012.

Responsibilities:

- Provide intellectual and administrative leadership in executing a \$4 million grant competition, including assistance in revising and publicizing a request for proposals, and coordinating the award selection process.
- Prepare a preliminary review and analysis of philosophical issues related to intellectual humility, including theological themes and concerns. This review will be provided to award competition semi-finalists to assist in more broadly contextualizing their projects and will serve as a starting point for an agenda-setting review article and a volume the post-holder will co-author
- Conduct a two-year research project in the area of Intellectual Humility related to philosophical or theological problems. The project should produce at least two refereed journal articles and two conference presentations
- Take a lead role in organizing and executing the workshops and conferences
- Co-edit a special issue of a psychology journal with contributions from RFP awardees
- Write a synoptic volume of empirical work from the psychology postdoc’s research project, the literature review, and the new research generated by the RFP awardees. The volume will be framed by the sorts of problems and issues raised by philosophical/theological participants and will be in collaboration with another post-holder
- Assist with every aspect of the project as needed

Qualifications:

Qualified applicants will have a doctorate with research experience in a relevant area of philosophy or philosophical theology and, preferably, some education in psychology, evolutionary studies, or behavioral economics related to the topic.
